

Firestop helping Businesses to understand Refugee problems.

Firestop has started an innovative partnership with Global Hand UK, by providing their premises to support the charity's work.

As a result, Firestop has been supporting the voluntary organisation Global Hand UK in running a Refugee simulation at the World Economic Forum's Davos conference earlier in the year. Organised in conjunction with the United Nations High Commission for Refugees, the "Refugee Run" allows the participants of WEF to experience the challenges faced daily by the world's 42 million displaced people.

For a moment in time, participants were thrust into another environment, stepping into the shoes of refugees in order to meet, through simulation, some of the struggles they face. Following the event a debrief invited participants to discuss the refugee situation, and explore ways to strategically engage with the issue.

Global Hand is a matching service, connecting businesses and charities to form partnerships aimed at addressing global need. It has been likened to a "humanitarian eBay."
